Your voting guide - City of Adelaide

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Voting in council elections is voluntary, but the Electoral Commission of South Australia does keep records of who has voted and may contact you after the election to discuss your voting experience. ECSA may also contact you if you don't vote to learn why.

Council elections are held every four years and are conducted entirely by post.

BALLOT PACKS

Most voters will receive only one ballot pack (a full entitlement).

Voters who have more properties or entitlements for other wards may receive additional ward ballot packs (ward only entitlements).

Ballot packs are being mailed progressively from Friday 14 October to Thursday 20 October 2022 and voters at the same address may not receive their ballot pack on the same day.

THE CONTENTS OF YOUR BALLOT PACK

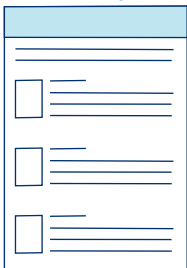
1. Ballot paper(s) for your entitlement, see below.
2. A booklet of profiles for the candidates contesting the election(s).
3. One 'ballot paper envelope' printed with your name and address.
4. A reply-paid envelope.

For a full entitlement ballot pack you will receive 3 ballot papers:

- Lord Mayor
- area councillor
- ward councillor.

For a ward-only entitlement ballot pack you will receive only 1 ballot paper for the ward councillor.

1. Candidate profiles



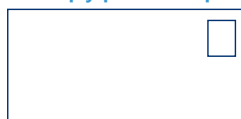
2. Ballot paper(s)

If you are missing any item from your ballot pack, call the 2022 Council Elections hotline on 1300 655 232 for replacement material.

VOTING

You are entitled to vote in council elections if you are:

- voting in your own right as a natural person
- an authorised officer of a body corporate acting on behalf of that body corporate
- a member of a group of persons acting on behalf of that group; and you are on the council voters roll as a resident, owner, or occupier of a rateable property.

You can only vote once in any election

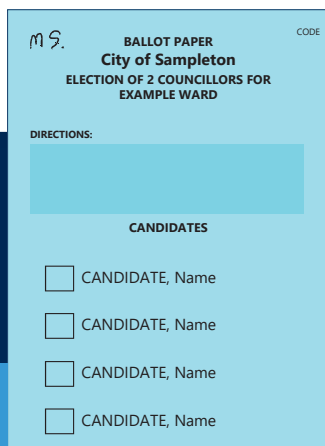
If you are an authorised officer of a body corporate or a member of a group who receives more than one full entitlement ballot pack:

- you may only complete and return one full entitlement ballot pack.
- additional full entitlement ballot packs should be completed by another authorised officer of the body corporate or member of the group.

If you receive multiple ward-only ballot packs, you may complete these ensuring you personally vote only once in each ward election.

HOW TO VOTE

- Follow the instructions printed on each ballot paper.
- For your vote to count, you **must number at least as many boxes as there are vacancies in the election** (the number of positions is listed at the top of the ballot paper).
- You must number them in order of your choice, starting at 1 for the candidate who is your first choice, 2 for your second choice and so on until you have numbered as many boxes as there are vacancies.

RETURNING YOUR BALLOT PAPER(S)

Place your completed ballot paper(s) in the 'ballot paper envelope', seal the envelope and complete the details on the flap, including signing the declaration.

Make sure you don't remove the flap of the 'ballot paper envelope', (Your details are used to confirm your voting entitlement and mark you off the electoral roll. The Electoral Commission SA will then remove the flap to ensure that your vote remains secret).

Place your sealed and signed 'ballot paper envelope' into the reply-paid envelope provided and mail it as soon as possible. No stamp is required.

For your vote to count, it must be received by the Electoral Commission of South Australia no later than the close of voting, **5:00 pm on Thursday 10 November 2022**.

Make sure you post your ballot paper(s) as soon as possible to avoid delivery delays.

NEED ASSISTANCE?

COMPLETING THE BALLOT PAPER(S)

If a voter has a disability and cannot mark their ballot paper(s), they may direct another person of their choice to complete the ballot paper(s) so long as that person is not a candidate or acting on behalf of a candidate.

COMPLETING THE DECLARATION

If a voter is unable to sign their name on the declaration flap of the ballot paper envelope, they should make a mark in the signature space and have a witness sign alongside to confirm the voter made the mark.

If the voter is physically unable to make their mark, they can still vote, but their assistant must call the voting hotline on **1300 655 232** for further directions and obtain a code to write on the declaration flap of the ballot paper envelope in place of a signature or mark.

POWER OF ATTORNEY

A power of attorney cannot be used to vote or sign on behalf of another person.
